

Mindful Journeys Privacy Policy

Mindful Journey Travel for the Soul LLC ("us", "we", or "our") operates the http://mindfuljourneystravel.com/ website and offline services (collectively, the "Services"). This page informs you of our policies regarding the collection, use, and disclosure of personal data when you use our Services and the choices you have associated with that data. We use your data to provide and improve the Services. By using the Services, you agree to the collection and use of information in accordance with this policy. Unless otherwise defined in this Privacy Policy, terms used in this Privacy Policy have the same meanings as in our Terms and Conditions.

This Privacy Policy discusses rights that apply to certain Users (defined below) based on their residency or location, such as to California residents under the California Consumer Privacy Act or to data subjects located in the European Union under the General Data Protection Regulation. These rights apply only to those Users to whom the law or regulation grants such rights.

You agree to the practices regarding your Personal Data described in this Privacy Policy when you use our Services, whether online or offline, use or browse our sites, or otherwise provide Personal Data to use directly or indirectly.

Definitions

Personal Data

Personal Data describes information that can be associated with you and can be used to identify you. Personal Data does not include information that does not identify a specific person.

Usage Data

Usage Data is data collected automatically either generated by the use of the Services or from the Services infrastructure itself (for example, the duration of a page visit).

Data Controller

Data Controller means a person who (either alone or jointly or in common with other persons) determines the purposes for which and the manner in which any personal data are, or are to be, processed. For the purpose of this Privacy Policy, we are a Data Controller of your data.

Data Processor (or Service Provider)

Data Processor (or Service Provider) means any person (other than an employee of the Data Controller) who processes the data on behalf of the Data Controller. We may use the services of various Service Providers in order to process your data more effectively.

Data Subject

Data Subject is any living individual who is the subject of Personal Data.

User

The User is the individual using our Services. The User corresponds to the Data Subject, who is the subject of Personal Data.

Information Collection and Use

When you use or inquire about our Services or use our sites, we may collect certain information relating to that use, some of which may be Personal Data. Personal Data we may collect includes your name, address, telephone number, email address, frequent flyer or related membership numbers, credit card or other payment instrument numbers.

To meet legal and regulatory requirements, to service accounts and process transactions, we will need to collect more Personal Data than for those who may simply inquire about our products and Services, but do not have an account with us. We use Personal Data for the purpose for which the data was collected, as well as for other legally-permitted purposes, such as to meet legal or regulatory obligations, to service accounts and process transactions, as part of litigation involving the Personal Data, to analyze and improve our products and Services, and to provide you with information regarding products and Services.

Tracking Cookies Data

We use cookies and similar tracking technologies to track the activity on our Service and hold certain information. Cookies are files with small amount of data which may include an anonymous unique identifier. Cookies are sent to your browser from a website and stored on your device. Tracking technologies also used are beacons, tags, and scripts to collect and track information and to improve and analyze our Service. You can instruct your browser to refuse all cookies or to indicate when a cookie is being sent. However, if you do not accept cookies, you may not be able to use some portions of our Services.

Examples of Cookies we use:

- Session Cookies. We use Session Cookies to operate our Services.
- Preference Cookies. We use Preference Cookies to remember your preferences and various settings.
- Security Cookies. We use Security Cookies for security purposes.

At this time our site does not respond differently when receiving browser do not track or similar signals.

Retention of Personal Data

We will retain your Personal Data for as long as is necessary for the purposes set out in this Privacy Policy. We will retain and use your Personal Data to the extent necessary to comply with our legal obligations (for example, if we are required to retain your data to comply with applicable laws), resolve disputes, and enforce our legal agreements and policies.

We will also retain Usage Data for internal analysis purposes. Usage Data is generally retained for a shorter period of time, except when this data is used to strengthen the security or to improve the functionality of our Services, or we are legally obligated to retain this data for longer time periods.

Disclosure of Personal Data

We disclose Personal Data for the same purposes for which we may use the data as well as for other legally-permitted purposes, such as to a Data Processor or Service Provider. We also may disclose Personal Data in other situations, including those described below.

Service Providers

We may employ third party companies and individuals to facilitate our Services, to provide the Services on our behalf, to perform Services-related tasks or to assist us in analyzing how our Services are used.

These third parties have access to your Personal Data only to perform these tasks on our behalf and are obligated not to disclose or use it for any other purpose.

Analytics

We may use third-party Service Providers to monitor and analyze the use of our Services.

Google Analytics

Google Analytics is a web analytics service offered by Google that tracks and reports website traffic. Google uses the data collected to track and monitor the use of our Services. This data is shared with other Google services. Google may use the collected data to contextualize and personalize the ads of its own advertising network.

You can opt-out of having made your activity on the Services available to Google Analytics by installing the Google Analytics opt-out browser add-on. The add-on prevents the Google Analytics JavaScript (ga.js, analytics.js, and dc.js) from sharing information with Google Analytics about visits activity.

Transfer of Personal Data

Security of Personal Data

- The categories of third parties with whom we share that Personal Data;
- The specific pieces of Personal Data we collected about you; and
- If we disclosed your Personal Data for a business purpose, a list identifying the Personal Data categories that each category of recipient obtained.

You may also have the right to request that we delete any of your Personal Data that we collected from you and retained, subject to certain exceptions. Once we receive and confirm your verifiable consumer request, we will delete (and direct our service providers to delete) your Personal Data from our records, unless an exception applies.

To exercise your rights under the CCPA, please submit a request to us by one of the following methods:

If you have an authorized agent, that person also may submit requests relating to your CCPA rights. We will need to obtain verification of the agent's identity and their authority to act on your behalf.
